freedom.

"The country is where it is today, thanks in large part to the generosity and kindness of neighbouring countries," he said.
The director of South African Oil & Gas Alliance (SAOGA), Adrian Strydom, has encouraged all South Africans to rise up against this horrific situation, not only because the rest of the world is watching them, but because it is bad and goes against the ideals of the country and the 'Ubuntu' spirit.
In response to the various cries of indignation around the world, security measures have been adopted to put an end to this violence.
On September 9, the South African police made 639 arrests related to xenophobic attacks.
